Citizens Opposed to Oil Pollution

Hyperion Resources has made a zoning request for "Energy Center Planned Development". The ECPD lists several permitted uses; refineries, power plants (coal fired or otherwise), any manufacturing, aggregate mining, residential housing and garbage dumps. Of the different permitted uses the Hyperion management team only has experience in garbage dumps.

It is interesting that an obscure Texas company with an estimated \$12.3M in annual sales will try to tackle the second largest capital project (Hyperion's estimate) in US history. They plan to construct a 400,000 barrel per day refinery in an area with no crude supply and no major markets. This has led many in the oil industry to take a very pessimistic view of this project.

The management of Hyperion Resources consists of; Albert DuBoise Huddleston, Robert Bruce Thomson, Miro Vranac, David Hopson, Steve Hudson, Michael Caruthers. As we can see from their biographies on the Hyperion Resources web site, they have no experience in refining. But these same people have a great deal of experience in garbage dumps with their work with Guardian Resources.

Guardian Resources is the parent company to Sentry Environmental. As we can see, the management team of Guardian is the same as Hyperion with the exception of Dale Warren Huddleston (Albert's brother). Aside from sharing the same management team, they both share the same address. Also as of October 2007, Guardian Resources is still very much a going concern.

From 1990 to 1994 Albert DuBoise Huddleston spent an estimated \$13M in trying to get permits for the 360 acre Sentry Environmental garbage dump in Denton, TX. Although Huddleston and the Sentry team had no prior experience in garbage they were planning on doing this much better than the rest of the industry. According to Dale Warren Huddleston; *"I think most people envision it as an open dump," he said. "We will work in small areas, about an acre at a time, and solid waste has to be covered daily with 6 inches of soil. There is a big distinction between a dump and a sanitary landfill, but it's hard to get that message across." "We will have berms, native plantings, landscaping. From the road, it will look like a housing addition," he said. "We want to do something that is first-class."*¹

Huddleston had no intention of operating the garbage dump, he was simply trying to get the permits in place so he could sell it off to a company that would have the ability to operate the dump. In the early 90's it was estimated that he could have made many

millions of dollars on this 360 acres if it was permitted for a garbage dump.

Fast forward 18 years and Albert Huddleston and his cronies are in Union County trying to get local zoning for a 4000 acre garbage dump. The times have changed and the industry has changed. It is becoming ever more difficult to overcome local opposition to landfills and areas of the east coast are having difficulty getting rid of their trash. This has led to more utilization of long haul rail to transport east coast garbage further west to areas that will welcome the trash. Major east coast population centers will gladly send their garbage 1000 miles or more via rail and a 4000 acre garbage dump with rail access will become a very valuable piece of property.

There will be state permits required for a garbage dump but these will be infinitely easier to obtain than the permits for a refinery. The major hurdle with regards to the state permits seems to be the local opposition. However, if a cover story is put out that guarantees thousands of high paying jobs it may be possible to convince the locals to go along with a garbage dump.

The zoning request that Huddleston is requesting will allow him to sell or subdivide this property and the new owners will be able to do whatever they want. Huddleston could easily transfer this area to Sentry and they could have another go at bringing in giant mounds of trash to an area.

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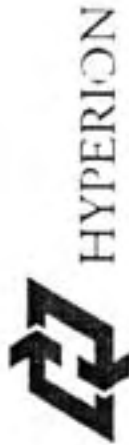

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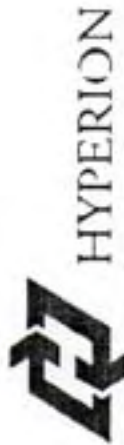

Landfill plan opposed in Denton County

Firm says site won't taint water or be eyesore

NORTHLAKE -- From the Thoroughbred farm on FM407, the westward horizon stretches limitless, a sea of gray green prairie that merges seamlessly with the vivid blue Texas sky.

Cathie Walsh isn't willing to trade that vista for high-rise trash.

Her parents own Carter-Walsh Thoroughbred Farm, a quarter-mile east of where Sentry Environmental Inc. of Dallas wants to build a landfill that would spread over 352 acres and rise 120 feet above the existing terrain.

"Can you imagine looking out and seeing that?" said Mrs. Walsh of the proposed landfill, which would loom a mile long, a half-mile wide and as high as a 12-story building.

Sentry officials call the landfill a state-of-the-art design that will neither cause economic catastrophe for neighbors nor pollute the watershed that empties into Grapevine Lake.

"And what they will see will be simply a grassy mound or ridge, with a gradual slope," said Warren Huddleston, project director for Sentry Environmental.

Mr. Huddleston said the landfill, if approved by state officials next year, will exceed health and safety federal standards that will take effect in October 1993.

He believes much of the opposition stems from a perception that all landfills are like old-style trash dumps.

"I think most people envision it as an open dump," he said. "We will work in small areas, about an acre at a time, and solid waste has to be covered daily with 6 inches of soil. There is a big distinction between a dump and a sanitary landfill, but it's hard to get that message across."

The Texas Water Commission will decide the fate of the landfill next year. After a series of preliminary hearings this year, including one last week in Denton, public hearings are scheduled in January on land-use issues pertaining to the Sentry landfill.

"We will discuss whether or not a landfill at that location will cause any sort of land-use problems," said Bill Zukauckas, hearing examiner for the Water Commission. "If we find there are problems, it stops there. If not, we go back for another hearing on the more technical aspects of the landfill."

The site Sentry wants for a landfill is 1.9 miles west of the intersection of FM407 and Interstate 35W. The Thoroughbred farm is to the east of the proposed site. Texas Lil's Dude Ranch is southwest. Cattle ranches and a horse training track are to the north.

Sentry applied in December 1990 for a permit to build a regional landfill to take municipal solid waste from the North Texas area, where existing landfills are running out of space.

The application said 100 vehicles a day would enter the site to deliver 775 tons of garbage each day. The volume would increase about 6 percent each year during the 33-year life of the landfill.

To provide adequate water drainage, the developers plan to build a channel along the east boundary with a system of levees and ditches to protect against a 100-year flood and divert water around the landfill.

Water that does leach through solid waste will be removed through another system and taken to a water treatment facility.

Some of the gratis work by Sentry will include a left turn lane from FM407 and a landscaped entrance, Mr. Huddleston said.

"We will have berms, native plantings, landscaping. From the road, it will look like a housing addition," he said. "We want to do something that is first-class."

Residents of Northlake, Justin and other small towns, as well as rural dwellers, aren't satisfied with those assurances, however.

The opposition started soon after word of the application began spreading in December 1990. People started calling other people and asking questions.

"We all met our neighbors," Mrs. Walsh said. "And we all started trying to figure out what we could do."

By January 1991, the opposition group formed CONTROL -- Citizens Opposing Northlake Trash, Refuse or Landfill. "We named it CONTROL because we think we ought to have some control over what happens in our community," Mrs. Walsh said.

Two years later, it is a well-oiled organization with a monthly newsletter, a core of committed workers

and membership of more than 700.

Along the way, CONTROL acquired a lot of supporters. Owners of small airports or landing strips nearby are worried about the influx of birds that usually accompany landfills.

Eleven neighboring cities and towns, two school districts and a long list of people, water districts and fire departments are officially opposing the landfill in hearings before the Texas Water Commission.

Last week, at another preliminary hearing in Denton, the city of Grapevine joined the list.

"Grapevine Lake is the sole water supply for half of the people in our town," said Grapevine council member Sharon Spencer. "We don't want a landfill just up the creek."

Ms. Spencer also questioned Sentry's announced plan to sell the site if the permit is granted.

"We have learned on the council that the good intentions of a developer seldom flow to new owners," she said.

Politicians and candidates have jumped on the bandwagon to publicly oppose the permit.

"It's an easy issue for politicians to grab on to," said Corral City Mayor Ken Holstein, one of the few local supporters of Sentry. "There's no downside to being against a landfill."

"But we've got to have some place to dump our trash."
